Main Duties

- Plan and prepare engaging individual instrumental lessons.
- Teach and deliver individual/small group music sessions and activities, ensuring effective learning takes place and students make excellent progress.
- Provide written feedback and give advice on student performance and skills.
- Research good practice of innovative and successful teaching.
- Prepare students for performances, examinations and auditions, as appropriate.
- Work with students to use music as a means of personal and social development.
- A desire to engage students across all year groups as part of our vibrant extra-curricular opportunities.
- Act as a role model, gaining the trust and respect of the people you work with.
- Communicate weekly with the Music Teacher, teachers and other academy staff, as well as students and parents, as appropriate.
- To promote additional opportunities for learning, including music centres, courses and other activities
- Undertake other duties and responsibilities commensurate with the grade of the post which may be required from time to time.
- Ensure you adhere to health and safety standards and work within school safeguarding guidance.
